

Dear Parents, Carers, Children and Members of the Mayfield Community,

I would like to share with families some of the fantastic feedback provided by our School Improvement Partner, who submitted his latest report to the Cranmer Education Trust Board and Standards Committee recently.

For those unaware, all schools work with their School Improvement Partner, typically four times each year. Our School Improvement Partner is an **independent** body who quality assures our work and our progress towards our improvement targets, for the Trust.



'The substantial amount of time and effort invested by the school in the evolution of programmes of prioritised content in English and Mathematics, and the preparation of staff in the Summer term 2020, has meant that the disruption to pupil's learning during a year of unprecedented challenge has been alleviated to the greatest possible extent'.



'Staff have embraced this challenge with characteristic positivity and professionalism'.



'The clarity of purpose transmitted by senior leaders coupled with a highly positive team ethos has meant that, whilst care and support for pupils has been of paramount importance, this has not detracted from a determination to deliver high quality of teaching & learning opportunities for all'.



'In reading, writing and mathematics, progress in relation to expected rates has been accelerated in all year groups'.

'The school has retained its focus on whole school development priorities, particularly the evolution of the school curriculum'.



'Notwithstanding the increased scale of this challenge as a result of the recent period of national crisis, given the commitment and talent of staff at all levels, there is undoubtedly the capacity within the school to continue its forward journey with sustained rapidity'.
