Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents, Carers, Children and Members of the Mayfield Community,

At Mayfield, we recognise that mental health is as important to a child's safety and well-being as their physical health.

It can impact on all aspects of their life, including their educational attainment, relationships, and physical well-being.

Mental health can also change over time, to varying degrees of seriousness, and for different reasons.

Some children try to hide how they are feeling or what they are doing, maybe because they think others won't understand or because they feel nobody can help.

Children may not always have the language or ability to communicate how they feel. They may be unsure of who to talk to and how to talk about the challenges they face.

This week we have talked to children in an age and ability appropriate way about the importance of mental health and well-being as part of 'Children's Mental Health Week'. This is part of our on-going work. We are so proud of our children for being so respectful, and for showing empathy and maturity. Children recognise that it's important to talk.


