We are confident that this positive attitude will continue, and we will have a super term.

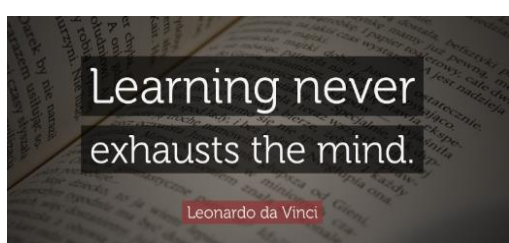

Leegan is already clearly enjoying his new books.



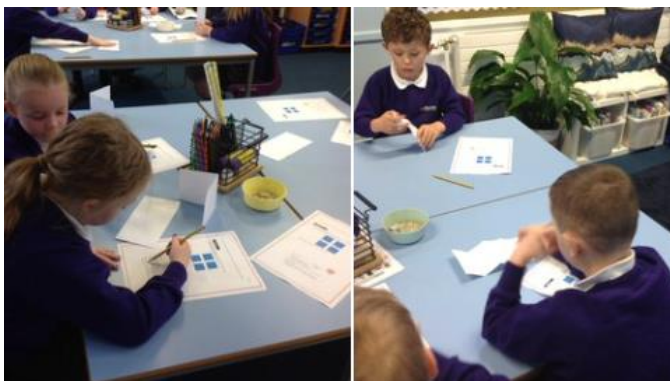
## Community partnerships
